Welcome

We have a long tradition of delivering local learning opportunities in North Kensington, beginning life on this site as a Victorian school. For over 150 years, we have united generations of diverse individuals and W10 residents through the power of education. Today, our vibrant community is still at the heart of everything we do.

This shared history is what saved the North Kensington Centre. Community activism ensured we remained a learning space after the tragedy of the Grenfell Tower fire, which led to a multi-million-pound renovation in 2023. Our transformed estate now matches our ambition: to offer the best student environment and experience available in London.

Our unique Centre has been helping local people to access tailored support and learning for decades. We teach the transferable and vocational skills for people to reach their goals – whether that's returning to education after a long break, achieving a maths or English GCSE, changing careers, being the first person in a family to go to university, or securing a dream job. We teach Access to HE courses to prepare people without traditional qualifications for study at university.

We also offer several Level 4 HNC qualifications and a Level 5

Foundation Degree in Early Years. In 2023, Morley College London was awarded a Teaching Excellence Framework (TEF) gold rating for outstanding higher education experiences/outcomes and our links with exceptional partners.

Our North Kensington Centre has also opened its doors to 16-18-year-old students with a broad range of opportunities to study locally, on programmes which then feed into our higher education opportunities both here at Morley or at other University centres.

With the support of our incredible stakeholders, we are changing the lives of hard-to-reach learners. Aspirational placements and experiences with global brands make seemingly impossible careers and employers attainable and within reach.


2024 Priorities

Maximise educational impact of facilities. After extensive refurbishment and investment, the North Kensington Centre boasts a mock hospital ward, recording studios, Science and networking labs and more. We want students and stakeholders to be creative and use our facilities in new and innovative ways.

Reach diverse audiences. We strive to make vocational education more accessible. Tactics have included working with Rugby Portobello Trust to deliver sessions for local parents looking to transition into education, and collaborating with Kensington Aldridge Academy, All Saints Catholic College and Cardinal Newman School to provide a consistent transition programme to inspire harder-to-reach young people to engage with post-16 learning.

Expand our provision at Levels 3 & 4. We're developing more courses that fill skills gaps and offer progression routes to higher education. This includes T Levels in Health (Science) and Digital Business Services, with additional Higher Technical Qualifications (HTQs) planned for September 2024.

Embrace new technologies to amplify innovation. We are passionate about using technology to meet industry needs, reach diverse learners, and boost sustainable employment. We continue to introduce in-demand STEM subjects such as IT technologies and cybersecurity.



Our Curriculum

At the North Kensington Centre, we create opportunities for local people to improve their lives through learning. We offer a warm, inclusive welcome and benefit from tailored training and support options.

We teach a range of qualifications such as 16-to-18 provision, short courses, and adult education classes designed in partnership with employers. These include creative programmes, essential skills, English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL), Digital & Business Skills, Music Production and Performance, Humanities, Counselling and Psychology, Health and Social Care, Early Years, and Applied Sciences.

Our training incorporates career boost courses for those looking to enhance job prospects. Our innovative market trader taster course is a unique vocational programme, delivered in partnership with the Royal Borough of Kensington & Chelsea, and an example of how we respond to stakeholder needs.

Our Stakeholder Advisory Group, alongside a range of curriculum-focused industry advisors, helps shape our curriculum to align with sector requirements today. Advisors challenge process, assessment contexts and scenarios, and offer support to give our students the edge when entering the jobs market.

Students also benefit from masterclasses, workshops, live briefs, trips, and work experience with global names such as British Esports and The V&A. We work closely with local employers to ensure that what we offer is what the community needs while giving students incredible experiences.





The North Kensington Centre has benefited from a multi-million pound refurbishment, which was undertaken in the early 2020s and finished in May 2023.

Exceptional Facilities

Thanks to £13.5 million funding from the Department for Education, new fully glazed front and rear extensions transform the open aspect of our building design. Contemporary facilities now include:

- A refurbished **crèche** that is free to parents who study, supporting inclusive learning.
- **State-of-the-art** science labs and well-equipped, modern classrooms.
- **Creative studios** for glass-making, jewellery, design, and ceramics.
- Sound-proofed music studios, radio production suite, and Mac IT suite for **music technologies**.
- Digital gaming and Esports **suites**.
- A multi-use community **performance hall** to develop performing arts opportunities.
- A bright, glass-fronted **café** and social space for staff, students, and the community.
- Re-instated **Morley Heart Gardens** with new landscaping.
- A new branch of **Morley Gallery**, offering dedicated exhibition

space for visual arts students.

- Additional secure **bicycle storage** to encourage green modes of transport.

We're proud to be the home of the Portobello Business Centre, which supports SMEs, entrepreneurs, sole traders, and start-ups in achieving their aims. We're open to business events of every kind, recently hosting Nanny Con (a convention for aspiring childcare specialists). We are proud to work with local business to support their development but also learn from them. We have worked with local initiative Grow2Know to design opportunities for local people to develop interest and skills in horticulture.

We want to share these incredible facilities with students and the community. We're eager to hear from stakeholders about uses for these new spaces, such as taster days, conferences, local art exhibitions, and more. We are open to ideas and excited to explore new opportunities.



Ayah's Story

Ayah Belahrach enrolled at the North Kensington Centre after attending an open evening. She was in the process of completing her GCSEs and wanted to find out what Morley College London had to offer. Up to this point, Ayah had been home-schooled and so wanted to study somewhere local with interesting practical opportunities. She said:

"The North Kensington Centre is great for me as it's really close to home. I came to an open day here and had a lovely chat with Fiona, the Head of School for Health, Education, Social and Applied Science.

"My goal is to study medicine as I've always liked to help people and have been intrigued by the human body since I was young. I liked the sound of the Level 2 BTEC in Applied Science and felt it was just what I needed.

"The course should be a great stepping stone to the Level 3 programme and hopefully on

to university. So far, it's really enjoyable. I never feel nervous coming here – it's so welcoming and friendly."

Although Ayah travelled across London for practical elements of her home-schooling, she now has access to the North Kensington Centre's new multi-million-pound facilities on her doorstep. Ayah will also benefit from work placements and trips to labs and museums as her course progresses.

These practical course elements are made possible thanks to the College's extensive employer partnerships. These vital industry relationships help to bring academic subjects to life and offer transformative student experiences.

The Applied Science team currently works with a wide range of partners in the fields of Health and Science including, Sania Therapeutics, Chelsea and Westminster Hospital, Central and North West London NHS wellbeing services, Golborne & Kensal Rise GP surgery, The Lookout at Hyde Park, QPR FC, and Imperial College London.



Inspirational Partners

We work with many partners who help us deliver industry-leading qualifications and experiences. Together, we mould the next cohort of industry professionals and help them to explore their passion.

A developing relationship with the world renowned National Theatre is now delivering inspiring opportunities for our students and local community. The National is one of the UK's most prominent publicly funded performing arts venues. Our shared belief in diversity and sustainability has led to many joint initiatives centring around community projects.

As well as advising our performing arts provision and running theatre workshops, the National Theatre is collaborating with us on a multi-year creative project in conjunction with local people and community organisations across North Kensington. This work links to the National's production of *Grenfell: in the words of survivors*.

The young people's programmes for the project are being run locally, specifically aimed at students who live, work, study, or socialise in North Kensington. We were delighted that both 'Space to Create' (the National Theatre's programme for young people aged 16-21 to devise and create bold new theatre) and 'Writing for Theatre' (a free playwriting course for 16-25-year-olds) took place in person at the North Kensington Centre for Skills.

Most recently National Theatre rehearsed its school tour of Jekyll and Hyde at the centre, with dress rehearsals open to students and staff. Their three-month tour will then conclude back at the North Kensington Centre, for us to invite local school students and interested parties to see the production here in W10.
